Sazolie College is a degree college built in the memory of Lt. Sazolie Peseyie (1914-2001) by his family. It was established under the aegis of Rüchüniü Academy of Education (RAE), named after his late granddaughter. Sazolie College and RAE, thus, birthed from this sense of undying love and respect for the departed souls.

Sazolie College has got permanent affiliation from Nagaland University. It is included under Section 2(f) and 12(b) of the UGC Act, 1956.

Sazolie College has been Accredited B++ (2nd Cycle) with a CGPA of 2.87 by NAAC, Bangalore.

The College is situated on the prominent slopes of Mount Puliebadze, which is a part of the lofty Barail Range. Located at Phezhu-Jotsoma, Kohima District, Nagaland (about 5 kms away from Kohima), it adjoins Kohima Science College on its northern side. On the eastern side, it has a panoramic view of Kohima Town and its surrounding areas. On the southern side, it is surrounded by the magnificent and majestic Puliebadze mountain range and on the west, by a lower range of beautiful undulating mountains. The evergreen, forested mountain ranges provide not only a protective wall but also a spectacular natural beauty. Situated in the midst of such a surrounding, the campus naturally has a secluded, serene and peaceful atmosphere, conducive to learning. Here, students, research scholars and teachers can devote themselves to serious and productive academic works throughout the year.





# **MOTTO AND LOGO**

Our motto is "Rise ever higher". Its inspiration comes from the fact that we need to keep on striving for excellence in various endeavours, whether physical, mental or spiritual. The Logo symbolises this aspiration as the eagle soars confidently upward above the mountain.

# **COLLEGE FACILITIES**

The College rests in 11 acres of land. There are five three-storey buildings and a multipurpose building/auditorium. The Auditorium facilitates games and sports activities and also houses the Library.

### LIBRARY

Computerised Library with SOUL 2.0 Software by INFLIBNET. It provides an array of books and magazines, periodicals, journals and newspapers, both local and international. The library has about 6000 volumes covering various fields of study.

### HOSTELS

The hostels (Spring Hostel for girls and Rock Hostel for boys), can accommodate around 140 students in total.

# STAFF QUARTERS

Around 50% of the faculty and staff are housed on-campus in permanent quarters, thereby enabling the College to function more efficiently.

# SNACKVILLE CAFETERIA

*Snackville*, the much frequented College Cafeteria, caters to the faculty, staff and students.

# WATER SOURCE

The College has its own water source from a nearby perennial stream with abundant supply throughout the year.

# MI ROOM

We have a Medical Inspection Room (MI Room) with an appointed Nurse who is available during class hours.

# FREE STUDENTSHIP

To encourage and promote education in Jotsoma, under whose jurisdiction the College is located, the Management of the College gives free education to some deserving students from the economically disadvantaged families. Every year, one student from Jotsoma, selected by the Village Council of Jotsoma, is enrolled into B.A. Semester I and given free education till Semester VI. A student desiring to avail this privilege must secure 45% or above in Higher Secondary Board Examinations.

# SCHOLARSHIP

Students may apply through the College for various Central and State Government scholarships or others if they are eligible, but the College does not hold the responsibility to provide the same.

# GAMES AND SPORTS

The College recognizes the importance of maintaining good physical health to promote sound mental and intellectual development. There are facilities for volleyball, basketball, tennis, table tennis and badminton. In 2009, the College had

the privilege of hosting the NU Air Rifle and Air Pistol Competition. The College Week/Sports Week is organized every year. Students are encouraged to participate in various competitions organised by other institutions and organisations. Sazolie College has been crowned Overall Champions for five times in the Nagaland University Sports Meet.

# BIENNIAL INTERCOLLEGIATE NAGA WRESTLING COMPETITION

To promote indigenous Naga Wrestling among college students by providing them with a platform to compete and develop their skills, the College was able to successfully conduct the 1st Biennial Intercollegiate Naga Wrestling Competition on 6 May 2022.

# **ACADEMIC PRACTICES**

# **Tutorial System**

The Tutorial System aims to nurture independent thinking and promote research activities in the students. It exposes them to a wider intellectual scholarship and initiates them into the culture of reading. It also helps them develop the art of writing proficiently on various subjects on their own. It keeps students engaged in serious academic works throughout the course. A great deal of responsibilities and opportunities are given to students to learn and do things independently. They are required to do many things on their own such as reading, collecting materials or data, outlining the paper, writing the essay, presenting the paper and participating in discussions, thereby contributing to the training and development of their minds.

# **Assessment and Examinations**

Continuous assessment of students is done through tests, assignments, field trips, projects and various other activities. A student's eligibility to write the End Term University Examinations is based on his/her participation and performance in these activities. Hence, students need to be serious and dedicated from the start because their success will not be determined by a single examination.

# Attendance

Education is made effective when it is disciplined and attendance is an integral part of effective education. Good attendance is strictly insisted upon. At least 80% attendance in the class is required for a student to qualify for the End Term University Examinations. Attendance in every official programme/activity of the College and Monday Chapel is compulsory.



# DISCIPLINE

Education is an adventure in the quest for excellence and the goal is attained through discipline and hard work. The College realizes the essentiality to guide and discipline students and to orient or initiate them to the desired values. For this, co-operation is sought from the students. They are expected to conduct themselves in a disciplined, dignified and responsible manner. Any act, which causes harm to themselves/others or interferes with the effective functioning of the College is considered as a breach of discipline, for which disciplinary actions are taken. Disciplinary action may take such forms as warning (verbal or written), fine, suspension and even expulsion from the hostel/college.

# THE FOLLOWING ARE SOME CONDUCTS ON THE CAMPUS WHICH ARE PROHIBITED

- Drinking/possessing alcohol and other intoxicating substances.
- 2. Abusing/possessing drugs and taking other harmful products. No. 1 & 2 will invite severe disciplinary action.
- 3. Chewing tobacco related products such as gutkha, betel nut, paan, khaini, etc.
- 4. Vandalising or damaging college property. This includes, tearing or damaging library books, journals and magazines.
- 5. Ragging in all forms (implicit or explicit) is viewed very seriously because of its extremely disruptive and anti-social nature.
- 6. Showing discourtesy and insubordination (disrespect) to faculty and staff, and using threat or violence against them.
- 7. Using abusive language or inflicting harm on other students.
- Cheating, stealing and bribery. Cheating includes copying and adopting other unfair means during class tests/examinations.
   Stealing is a serious offence. Bribery or any attempt to commit bribery. Bribery is viewed very seriously because it perverts justice.
- 9. Involving in fights with others on or off the College campus.
- 10. Absenting oneself from class without leave of absence, bunking class and non-cooperation in doing class activities, writing assignments, class tests, examinations, etc.
- 11. Attending class is compulsory on the opening day of the College after every holiday and also on the closing day before every holiday. Fine is imposed on the absentee for both.
- 12. Possessing and circulating pornographic materials in any form.
- 13. Involving in any immoral conduct which can cause scandal in the local context like dressing immodestly/indecently/provocatively, vulgar display of affection through physical contact like caressing/petting, or any unchaste/immoral behaviour in public.

# GENERAL NORMS

- 1. Students are ultimately responsible to the Principal for any misconduct, or breach of rules framed by the College.
- 2. Students are required to attend all classes.
- 3. Students are also required to attend all the functions, talks by visitors/special invitees, seminars and conferences organized by the College.
- 4. Students should obtain all their textbooks within the first month.
- 5. Students who are from places other than Jotsoma and Kohima should have a local guardian.
- 6. The only recognized student body in the college is the Sazolie College Students' Council. No other tribal union or society can be formed. Tribal meetings/fellowships are not allowed on campus without prior permission from the Principal and leave is not granted for such meetings.
- 7. Students are required to pay their fees on time.
- 8. Any student can be asked to leave College on grounds of poor academic performance, bad attendance, breach of discipline and non-payment of fees.
- 9. Hostellers are required to pay their mess fee before the 15th of every month.
- 10. UGC notification/directive on Refund of Fees will be followed if a student wants to withdraw his/her admission.
- 11. If a student desires to leave the College before the completion of the semester/session, he/she must clear the fees/dues and return the books borrowed from the College Library.
- 12. Any hosteller desiring to leave the hostel before the completion of the session/semester must give a one-month prior notice to the Principal/Administrator through the Warden. If a student fails to do so, he/she will forfeit the caution money.

# POLITICAL SCIENCE AND HISTORY

Admission to MA will begin as soon as the Undergraduate (BA) Results is declared by Nagaland University. Admission Form can be obtained from the College Office. It can also be downloaded from the College Website.

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- 1. Students with Honours/Major in BA in the concerned subject/programme will be given preference.
- 2. An applicant must have passed three-year Degree Course with Honours/Major and with at least 50% of marks and 55% for General/other Subjects/Streams. There will be 5% relaxation for SC/ST category.
- 3. Reservation in the courses offered by the College shall be as per the norms/rules laid down by the College. The Nagaland University guidelines shall be referred to and followed whenever required.
- 4. No. of seats in both the Programmes is 45 (allotted by Nagaland University).
